- All COVID-19 HOPWA Waivers have expired
 - The Property Standard waiver, which expired on 3/31/22 allows for a deadline of 6/30/22 for initial physical inspections to be completed

Monitoring and Evaluation

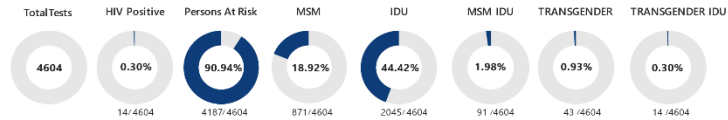
RWB Monitoring process:

 - Contract for newly formed Delaware County Health Department is in the approval process. Contract to start July 1, 2022.

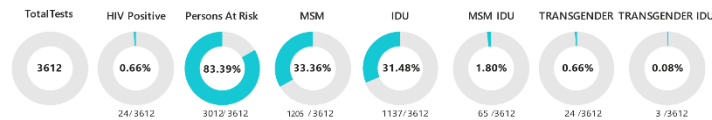
PPA Performance Measures

Special Pharmaceutical Benefits Program (SPBP)

- SPBP Advisory Council meetings:
 - Most recent meeting: Thursday, April 28th 10am-12pm (Virtual meeting)
 - Next meeting: Thursday, July 28th 10am-12pm (Virtual meeting)
- The SPBP Drug Formulary and Pharmacy Network list have been updated on the SPBP website
- The SPBP medication adherence pilot program has ended and was successful in improving medication adherence for SPBP clients. SPBP plans to roll this program out as an ongoing medication adherence program. We are currently working with our vendor to implement the adherence program after the internal contractual processes are in place.
- SPBP Enrollment Changes:
 - Clients are now eligible to enroll in SPBP using either their individual income or household income plus the additional income allowances for each spouse/dependent in the household
 - The enrollment timeframe for SPBP was changed from 6 months to every 1 year. The application required to be submitted will continue to alternate

between a full application and express application on a yearly basis.

- National Alliance of State and Territorial AIDS Directors (NASTAD) released the 2022 National ADAP Formulary Database Survey for 49 states (not DE) and 4 territories that submitted data. Highlights of the survey are below:
 - 29 cover the long acting injectable Cabenuva
 - 39 cover direct acting Hep C meds
 - 44 cover one or more of the most frequently prescribed mental health treatment meds
 - 44 cover substance use treatment meds
 - 30 cover naloxone specifically
 - 31 cover estrogen, progesterone, testosterone products
 - 31 say they plan to add Covid treatment meds to formularies after fully approved and commercialized

Prevention

- Staffing: Gaby Dashler, HIV/HCV testing associate, left the program a conditional offer was made to a potential candidate.

- Grant Activities:
 - The new Participating Provider Agreement (PPA) has been approved and will be rolled out over the

next couple months. Changes to the PPA include risk-based hepatitis C testing in clinical settings, higher reimbursement for mobile clinical services, elimination of the tier system for non-clinical HIV/syphilis testing, elimination of the non-clinical chlamydia/gonorrhea testing as its own service, elimination of outreach as its own service, and stronger performance standard language.

Additionally, the Department has letters of agreement (LOA) with many providers across the state that receive in-kind laboratory services and rapid test kits. These providers serve the same priority populations, but don't have the capacity to be a PPA. In order for them to continue offering these services they will have to sign a PPA so they are held to the required performance standards. The performance standards include complete and accurate data reporting, and ensuring they are serving the priority populations.

- A PEP/PrEP provider list was added to the Departments HIV landing page.
- All PPA providers are now able to offer a qualitative HIV-1 RNA test for uninsured PrEP clients to meet the new CDC recommendations released in January. This is especially important for those clients seeking Apretude, the injectable PrEP.
- HIV Prevention, the STD program and the University of Pittsburgh are collaborating on a Partner Services Media Campaign. The purpose of the campaign is to normalize Partner Services as a necessary public health practice to improve client participation and build trust between the community and the Department.
- We are anticipating the new Notification of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for the 2023-2027

CDC integrated HIV surveillance and prevention grant in June. This will require HIV surveillance and prevention to apply for continued funding for the next five-year grant cycle.

HIV Surveillance and Epidemiology Updates

- Staffing:
 - With the retirement of Bonnie Krampe last year, we have moved Ikechukwu Onukogu into that position. Ike was previously the Coordinator of Perinatal HIV Exposure Surveillance.
 - Emily Tholen resigned her Epidemiology Program Specialist recently and we have made offer to someone and hoping to conclude the hiring process this month.
- Our abstract titled “Assessment of Transgender People Living with Human Immunodeficiency Virus infection in Pennsylvania” was accepted for presentation at the upcoming 2022 Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists conference holding in Louisville, Kentucky in June 2022.
- With the approval of the Pennsylvania Department of Health HIV Cluster/Outbreak Monitoring and Response Plan, we are now:
 - Preparing materials to train disease intervention specialists and stakeholders
 - In discussion on distribution plan
 - Developing flyers for public consumption
- While there are no new HIV clusters in recent months, we continue to investigate seven active clusters.

The Medical Monitoring Project

- The Medical Monitoring Project (MMP) is beginning the 2022 cycle in June.
- PA DOH staff will be contacting providers about the new list for 2022 to help recruitment and let people know the project is legitimate.

AIDS Activities Coordinating Office (AACO)/Philadelphia Department of Public Health

- Update to Philly Keep on Loving (PKOL) Prep providers' map and list. **Newly added**** now there's a section on the page that gives detailed information and contact persons at their program.

- Dr. Cheryl Bettigole, MD, MPH, Philadelphia Health Commissioner announced on April 11, 2022. - Congratulations to Coleman Terrell, on the appointment as the Director for the Division of Disease Control for the Philadelphia Health Department.

Office of STDs

- Please welcome Candace Sillers Beck. She joins us as a Public Health Program Associate too. She joins us with experience from Altercare in Harrisburg.

- Please also welcome Sarah Sara Wojciechowski, also a PHPPU, who has experience as a disease intervention specialist with the with the Philadelphia Department of Health.
- We continue to see a high rate of syphilis cases across the nation including PA, and that in turn results in an increase in congenital syphilis cases. Our focus right now is testing and treatment of syphilis and making sure that providers are following the recommended guidelines for testing during prenatal care at the first prenatal visit, the beginning of the 3rd trimester and again at delivery.
- It is important that anyone who's getting a HIV blood draw should also be tested for syphilis at that same time. It just takes one blood draw to test for both HIV and syphilis.
- We have a listing of our STD free and confidential clinics on the STD web page.
- We have also received some additional funding in the STD program to expand upon disease intervention staff throughout the state that will be making connections throughout the medical community. This will also allow us to follow up with partner services.
- We also have a new Program Coordinator working with resistant gonorrhea.
- Initiatives around congenital syphilis (*from Jill Garland*):
 - Doctor Johnson, our acting secretary is a huge advocate and this is an important issue for her maternal and child health and STDs. We have been working with her.
 - We had a meeting with leaders from Med Express this week to talk about the importance of screening for syphilis and HIV, especially if clients present with with symptoms of gonorrhea or chlamydia. We want to make sure that they are then following up with a syphilis and HIV test. They were very receptive to that we think we'll be able to do some grand rounds with their clinicians.

- Doctor Johnson also sent out a letter with information on number of things, but including the screening recommendations for syphilis and pregnancy and HIV pregnant women. It also included what the CDC recommends and what we recommend as a department, just as a reminder. We have seen some missed opportunities for the testing in certain situations.
- Doctor Johnson is really a great supporter of this and we're really excited about that.

Northwest Region

- From HPG Community Member Leah Maganotti, currently the interim director of the Northwest Region
- We rebranded in April. Formally, we were called the “Northwest Pennsylvania Rural AIDS Alliance” or for short the “Northwest Alliance.” We are now called the “PA Thrive Partnership.” We have the same services we’ve had before but are expanding social media. Social media presence is very important in how we live today and this will help us get the word out more.
- We are also in the process of hiring a dietician and moving towards an expanded STI program with PrEP.
- Our grant is under Clarion University. However, on July 1st, three schools in our region (Clarion, Edinboro, and California University) are going to merge to create Pennsylvania, Western University, so we will be called Pennsylvania Western University Clarion (the other two will be the same but with Edinboro and Cal U at the end).

The Rustbelt Center for AIDS Research (CFAR) and The University of Pittsburgh

- CFAR was recently funded by the National Institutes of Health. This CFAR will effectively position HIV investigators from Case Western Reserve University (Cleveland, OH) and the University of Pittsburgh with resources and services to support cutting edge and interdisciplinary collaborative research endeavors in

	<p>HIV/AIDS. By combining complementary programs from these institutions, the goal is to offer a comprehensive range of services and activities to support current research and train the next generation of HIV investigators. Dr. Friedman (Pitt) co-leads the Ending the HIV Epidemic Strategic Working Group component of this CFAR and hopes to work with the Pennsylvania HPG and its Ohio counterpart to forge connections between these groups and help generate community-based HIV prevention and care projects in Pennsylvania and Ohio.</p>
